GATHERING IN WORSHIP

LIGHTING THE ADVENT CANDLES

In Advent as the days get shorter and the darkness grows, we as people of faith light candles. Through centuries of worshipping together, through reading the same stories over and over, we have learned how to cope with growing darkness even if we can't stop it. We turn to the light.

We have seen how, illogically and impossibly, four candles surrounded by greenery somehow are enough. They remind us of the truth that God will not let us face darkness alone. They flicker with the truth that in impossible situations God sends new and even illogical beginnings like a baby born in a stable under the light of a star.

We begin our worship remembering the Advent journey of peace, hope, joy and love. As the four candles are lit, we invite you to join in singing this verse of *O Come*, *O Come*, *Emmanuel* as printed below:

O come, O Dayspring, come and cheer Our spirits by your advent here; Love stir within the womb of night, And death's own shadows put to flight. Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to you, O Israel!


