You've all probably noticed by now that Debussy is one of my favorite composers! His music has a way of creating a calm, still, and often profound spiritual atmosphere. Debussy wrote titles to his Preludes as an afterthought -- almost a metaphorical suggestion rather than an overt imposition. The middle piece -- the Sunken Cathedral -- depicts church bells ringing as a magnificent tower rises from the sea.

I'll talk with god...


