

A SERVICE OF FOOD AND FELLOWSHIP

Maundy Thursday was a day when Jesus shared a meal with his disciples. The meal Jesus shared was to remember the Passover and the story of God's deliverance. We invite you to linger in your meal to get to know each other and to prepare to be in worship.

You might bless your meal first with everyone sharing one thing they are grateful for and then using this simple meal blessing written by Elizabeth Young:

God, thank you for the meal we are about to eat. Bless all the people who contributed to it, and all who are sharing it at this table. We are grateful for this food which sustains us, and for the spiritual food that saves us, today and always. Amen.

SHARING STORY AND MEAL

Reading: Mark 14:12-16

Invitation:

One: He was always the Guest

Two: In the homes of Peter and Jairus, Martha and Mary, Joanna and Susanna.

One: He was always the guest.

Two: At the meal tables of the wealthy where he plead the case of the poor.

One: He was always the guest.

Two: Upsetting polite company, befriending isolated people,

One: Welcoming the stranger, he was always the guest.

One: He is the host.

Two: Those who wish to serve him must first be served by him, One: Those who want to follow him must first be fed by him,

Two: Those who would wash his feet must first let him make them clean.

One: For this is the table where God intends us to be nourished

Two: This is the time when Christ can make us new.

One: So come, you who hunger and thirst for a deeper faith, for a better life, for a fairer world.

Two: Jesus Christ, who has sat at our tables, now invites us to be guests at his.
