

### **Music Notes**

Consolation in Db Major by Franz Liszt was published in 1850, a year after Chopin died. It is widely believed that Liszt wrote this piece as a tribute to Chopin in the style of his Db Major Nocturne.

During the Gathering Music this morning, I will play two versions of "This Little Light of Mine" in honor of Black History Month, as well as mirroring our reading from Matthew. The first version you will hear is the one all of us were taught as children. This is assumed to be an African-American spiritual. In fact, in most publications this is the credit given. Today however, Henry Dixon Loes (1892-1965) is believed to have written it. Loes was a church music director and evangelist.

The second version I will play is a Spiritual and of the two, my favorite.
