I therefore, the prisoner in the Lord, beg you to lead a life worthy of the calling to which you have been called, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, making every effort to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to the one hope of your calling, one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, who is above all and through all and in all.

But each of us was given grace according to the measure of Christ's gift. Therefore it is said, 'When he ascended on high he made captivity itself a captive;

he gave gifts to his people.'

(When it says, 'He ascended', what does it mean but that he had also descended into the lower parts of the earth? He who descended is the same one who ascended far above all the heavens, so that he might fill all things.) The gifts he gave were that some would be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers, to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, until all of us come to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to maturity, to the measure of the full stature of Christ. We must no longer be children, tossed to and fro and blown about by every wind of doctrine, by people's trickery, by their craftiness in deceitful scheming. But speaking the truth in love, we must grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ, from whom the whole body, joined and knitted together by every ligament with which it is equipped, as each part is working properly, promotes the body's growth in building itself up in love.



Walking Each Other Home ~ notes by Cathy Clark

Walking Each Other Home is one of the songs my Threshold Choir sings at bedside to Hospice patients, but it is equally applicable to the rest of us, no matter where we are on life's journey.

Music Notes ~ Peter Frost

William Billings (1746-1800), When Jesus Wept (Offertory), was born in Boston. His wife died in 1795 leaving him with six children under the age of eighteen.

Though Billings' work was very popular during his lifetime, he was quite hampered by the primitive state of copyright laws. Most of his most popular music had been widely reprinted without his permission in other peoples hymnals, virtually copyright-free.

He died in Boston, in poverty, at the age of 53.

His funeral was announced in the Columbian Centinel as follows: *Died-Mr. William Billings, the celebrated music composer. His funeral will be tomorrow at 4 o'clock, PM from the house of Mrs. Amos Penniman, in Chamber-street, West-Boston.*

For a long time after his death his music was almost completely neglected. Most of the songs ended up being preserved in the Sacred Harp singing traditions in the South.

In the latter half of the twentieth century the music of William Billings enjoyed a revival with much of his music being republished under his name.
