Until the time when we were mature enough to respond freely in faith to the living God, we were carefully surrounded and protected by the Mosaic law. The law was like those Greek tutors, with which you are familiar, who escort children to school and protect them from danger or distraction, making sure the children will really get to the place they set out for.

But now you have arrived at your destination: By faith in Christ you are in direct relationship with God. Your baptism in Christ was not just washing you up for a fresh start. It also involved dressing you in an adult faith wardrobe—Christ's life, the fulfillment of God's original promise.

In Christ's family there can be no division into Jew and non-Jew, slave and free, male and female. Among us you are all equal. That is, we are all in a common relationship with Jesus Christ. Also, since you are Christ's family, then you are Abraham's famous "descendant," heirs according to the covenant promises.



Music Notes ~ **Scott Bailey**

Louis Vierne was the organist at Notre-Dame de Paris from 1900 until his death in 1937. Much of his compositional output was organ music including his six organ symphonies, his 24 Fantasy Pieces, and the Vingt-quatre pièces en style libre from which come the Canon and Préambule this morning. His students included Maurice Duruflé and Nadia Boulanger.

H.T. Burleigh had been accepted to the National Conservatory of Music in New York around 1892. While studying there, and serving as a handyman and maintenance worker, he caught the attention of the conservatory's director Antonin Dvorak who at the time was working on his "New World Symphony". The two formed a friendship and musical collaboration. Burleigh often sang African American spirituals to which Dvorak would remark that the melodies were the true folk music of America.

Written by Fr. Peter Scholtes, They'll Know We Are Christians By Our Love is taken from a quote about how nonbelievers used to describe Christians in early church history; "Behold, how they love one another." The text reflects on the words we find in the baptismal covenant of many denominations; "Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?"

Brian Wren is one of the more prolific hymn writers of the late 20th century. His texts, including I Come With Joy, are deliberately inclusive and are widely circulated in hymnals of all denominations. The tune "Land of Rest" was widely known in Appalachia but has its roots in English and Irish ballads.

Peter Lutkin was an American conductor, organist, and composer working at Northwestern University as a professor and dean. He is most famous for his choral benediction The Lord Bless You and Keep You. He was a specialist in writing for a cappella choirs and was well regarded as director of choirs and champion of a cappella singing.
